David Alleva, PhD won 1 Major: 1990 Capri to Naples. He started his six-year professional marathon swimming career with a third place at the 42 km (26-mile) Traversée Internationale Duc Lac Memphremagog marathon swim in Quebec, Canada. One year later, he won the 1989 Ocean Marathon Swim in Atlantic City, New Jersey (23 miles, 8 hours and 5 minutes) and was the Long Distance Swimming World Champion in 1990 after winning the Capri-Napoli marathon swim in Naples, Italy (36 km, 6 hours and 57 minutes). David consistently placed in the top three throughout his marathon career that included second place in the 1991 Traversée Internationale du Lac St-Jean 40 km marathon in 10 hours and 19 minutes and in 1993 in 10 hours and 28 minutes and third place in the 1990 Santa Fe-Coronda River 57 km (36-mile) marathon in Argentina in 7 hours and 9 minutes.
